Dear Parents, Caregivers and Community Members,

Change to school Enrolment Management Plan (EMP)

Bohlevale State School has an Enrolment Management Plan (EMP) which outlines how the school manages enrolments. The current [EMP](#) is available on our website. Parents and caregivers can ascertain their eligibility for enrolling children at Bohlevale State School by visiting the [edMap](#) site.

With the opening of a new state school in North Shore our catchment will change in 2018.

All Prep-Year 5 students actively enrolled at Bohlevale SS at the end of 2017 are eligible to continue their enrolment at Bohlevale State School in 2018 regardless of which school catchment they live in. Furthermore, primary school aged siblings of children actively enrolled at Bohlevale SS in 2018 are also eligible to enrol at Bohlevale SS regardless of their residential address. This means, for example, that if you live in the "New school – Burdell" catchment and have a child who will be continuing at Bohlevale in 2018 and you also have a child who will be starting Prep in 2018 he/she is eligible to enrol at Bohlevale State School in 2018.

Parents living in the new school catchment may also decide to transfer their primary school aged children to the new school. We ask that if this is your intention that you let the school office know at your earliest convenience. Please note that if a BSS student who does not live in the Bohlevale SS catchment transfers to the new school (or any other school) in 2018 he/she will not be able to transfer back to Bohlevale SS unless he/she lives in the Bohlevale SS catchment.

Bohlevale State School Playgroup – for children aged 3-5 years

Expressions of interest invited to participate in Term 4

We are keen to offer our current Bohlevale State School families and new families within our enrolment catchment area interested in transitioning to Bohlevale SS in future years, the opportunity to engage in a 'Playgroup' targeted at children aged between 3 and 5 years of age. Playgroup provides a rich learning environment where developmental opportunities are abundant and foundations are created for literacy and numeracy, socialisation, emotional behaviour and physical development. It is intended that the playgroup would initially operate for 2 hours once a week on our school site and would be run under the banner of 'Playgroup Queensland.' School staff would assist in facilitating the playgroup program. Each attending child is required to have a parent/caregiver in attendance with them for insurance purposes. There is **no cost** to be involved.

To assist in finalising specific planning for the implementation of this initiative we are seeking advice from families about their **interest in participating**. A minimum of 5 families are required for the Playgroup to proceed. Gold Pins

To be eligible for a gold pin students must consistently show exemplary behaviour and have **received NO major or minor referrals in Terms 1, 2 and 3 of 2017.** Students must have been enrolled at Bohlevale SS on or before 10 July to be eligible for a gold pin.

Students will be presented with their gold pin at an assembly early Term 4. This will allow the eligible students to wear their gold pin all through Term 4.

Eligibility for a gold pin is not linked to the number of gotchas a student has earned.

Procedural Reminders – Late Arrivals and Early Departures

School starts at 8:30 a.m. and students should be in their classrooms at this time. Students arriving at school after 8:45 a.m. need to present to the school office and request a late slip.

School finishes at 2:30 p.m. and children should not be leaving school early except for exceptional circumstances. In the event that parents/carers need to collect their children early we ask that parents present at the office, sign their child out early and get an early departure slip and then collect their child from the relevant classroom.

Please note that office staff will not be calling down to classrooms and asking for students to meet their parents at the office.

Prep Enrolments 2018

We are now accepting 2018 enrolments into Prep for children born between 1st July 2012 and 30th June 2013. Appointments can be made by phoning the school on 47 293 555. Please note that your student's birth certificate must be sighted by school staff as part of the enrolment process and proof of residency in the school's enrolment catchment area must also be provided.

Parents or legal guardians who wish to enrol their child at the school will need to demonstrate that the student's principal place of residence is within the catchment area.

Current proof of residency at the address indicated can be provided by way of one of each of the following:

- One primary source – a current lease agreement, or rates notice, or unconditional sale agreement, **and**
- One secondary source – a utility bill (e.g. electricity, gas) showing this same address and parent/legal guardian's name

Early Entry into Prep

It is possible for children born 1st-31st July, 2013 to be considered for early entry into Prep in 2018 if the child is considered ready for education considering the full range of their attributes.

Early Entry to Prep is an **exception** and should only be considered where it is in the best educational interests of a child.

Mental Computation Strategies – Addition

Mental computation is the most common form of computation used in everyday life. Mental computation refers to the process of working out and obtaining exact or approximate answers mentally. When calculating mentally, students select from a range of strategies, depending on the numbers used. As they develop their knowledge of strategies, students select those that are more efficient and effective for them.

Here are a few early addition strategies you might hear your children talk about:

STRATEGY/EXAMPLES	EXPLANATION
<p>Count on</p> <p>- when adding small numbers like 1,2 or 3</p> <p>7 + 1 1 + 6</p> <p>11 + 2 2 + 9</p> <p>8 + 3 3 + 15</p>	<p>- count on from the larger number; 'think big, count on'.</p> 
<p>Near doubles – Doubles +1</p> <p>- when one number is only 1 bigger than the other number</p> <p>4 + 5 8 + 7</p>	<p>- double the smaller number then add 1</p> <p>4 + 5 = ___</p> 
<p>Near doubles – Doubles +2</p> <p>- when one number is only 2 bigger than the other number</p> <p>7 + 9 7 + 5</p>	<p>- double the smaller number then add 2</p> 
<p>Build to 10</p> <p>- when adding a number that is close to 10 eg. 7, 8 or 9</p> <p>9 + 5 8 + 4</p>	<p>- use part of the smaller number to build the larger number to 10, then add what is left</p> <p>9 + 5 = ___</p>
